- (1) in view of the fact that the PPA is coming to an end in the year 2025 and is unlikely to be renewed and if renewed it would be on a less favourable terms for Eswatini due to the growing energy crisis with Eskom; what plan of action does the Ministry have to mitigate the impact thereof;
- (2) what is the Ministry's Strategy to make Eswatini self-sufficient in energy; and
- (3) what strides are being made by Eswatini Energy Regulatory Authority (ESERA) in as far as alternative energy sourcing of the country is concerned?
